01.	Simple Present Tense	Subject + Base Verb (s/es for third person)	Tom <b>eats</b> apple.
02.	Present Continuous/ Progressive Tense	Subject + is/am/are + Present Participle	Toms <b>is eating</b> the apples.
03.	Present Perfect Tense	Subject + Has/have + Past Participle	Tom <b>has eaten</b> the apples.
04.	Present Perfect Continuous/ Progressive Tense	Subject + Has/have + been + Present Participle + since/for	Tom <b>has been eating</b> apples <b>for 15 minutes</b> .
05.	Simple Past Tense	Subject + Verb(+ed) or irregular verb	Tom <b>ate</b> an apple.
06.	Past Continuous Tense	Subject + was/were + Present Participle	Tom <b>was eating</b> the apples.
07.	Past Perfect Tense	Subject + had + Past Participle	Tom <b>had eaten</b> the apples.
08.	Past Perfect Continuous Tense	Subject + had + been + Present Participle	Tom <b>had been eating</b> the apples.
09.	Simple Future Tense	Subject+ will/shall+ Base Verb	Tom <b>will eat</b> apples.
10.	Future Continuous Tense	Subject + will/shall be + Present Participle	Tom <b>will be eating</b> apples.
11.	Future Perfect Tense	Subject + will have + Past Participle	Tom <b>will have eaten</b> apples before I came.
12.	Future Perfect Continuous/ Progressive Tense	Subject + will have been + present participle + since/for	Tom <b>will have been eating</b> apples for many days.
13.	Past Future Tense	Subject + would + base verb	Tom told that he <b>would eat</b> apples in one hour.
14.	Past Future Continuous Tense	Subj + should/would be + present participle	Tom told that he <b>would be eating</b> apples all the day long.
15.	Past Future Perfect Tense	Subj.+ should / would have + past participle	Tom said that he <b>would have eaten</b> apples.
16.	Past Future Perfect Continuous Tense	Subject + would have been + present participle	Tom said that he <b>would have been eating</b> apples.
